#### **Entity Structure: \***

Canine Friends is a nationwide organisation. There are 31 regions. Each region has at least one Liaison officer (LOs). All 31 LOs report to either a North Island or South Island Field Officer.

Each region reports to the National Committee which is based in the Wellington region. The National Committee is responsible for setting and maintaining national standards, codes of conduct and necessary operational policies. All regions will observe the national standards, codes of conduct and any operational policies set by the National Committee.

Canine Friends consists of members. Members can be ordinary or exempt (either LOs or have provided 2 years of service or Honorary members)

Honorary Members are elected by resolution at the Annual General Meeting. Honorary Members are exempt from payment of subscriptions and enjoy full member privileges.

Committee meetings are held once a month. Quorum shall be five members. The current elected officers are:

Treasurer - Victoria Caccioppoli

Secretary - Leanne Gibson

Field Officer North Island - Chris Partridge & Field Officer South Island - Carol Millican

There are also a number of Committee members that perfrom specific tasks for Canine Friends Pet Therapy such as the New Members Co-ordinator, the Database Manager, the Newsletter Editor, the Funding Co-ordinator and the Communications Manager.

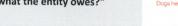

### **Opinion**

We have audited the performance report of Canine Friends Pet Therapy Incorporated on pages 1 to 9, which comprises the entity information, the statement of service performance, the statement of receipts and payments for the year ended 31 March 2018, the statement of resources and commitments as at 31 March 2018, and the statement of accounting policies and other explanatory information.

In our opinion, the accompanying performance report of Canine Friends Pet Therapy Incorporated gives a true and fair view, in accordance with Public Benefit Entity Simple Format Reporting – Cash (Not-For-Profit).

# **Basis for Opinion**

We conducted our audit in accordance with International Standards on Auditing (ISAs). Our responsibilities under those standards are further described in the *Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Performance Report* section of our report. We are independent of Canine Friends Pet Therapy Incorporated in accordance with the ethical requirements that are relevant to our audit of the performance report in *Code of Ethics for Professional Accountants (IESBA Code)*, and we have fulfilled our other responsibilities in accordance with these requirements. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our opinion.

#### **Key Audit Matters**

Key audit matters are those matters that, in our professional judgment, were of most significance in our audit of the performance report of the current period. These matters were addressed in the context of our audit of the performance report as a whole, and in forming our opinion thereon, and we do not provide a separate opinion on these matters.

# Responsibilities of Management and Those Charged with Governance for the Performance Report

Management is responsible for the preparation of the performance report that give a true and fair view in accordance with International Financial Reporting Standards and in accordance with Public Benefit Entity Simple Format Reporting – Cash (Not-For- Profit), and for such internal control as management determines is necessary to enable the preparation of performance reports that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.

However, future events or conditions may cause Canine Friends Pet Therapy Incorporated to cease to continue as a going concern.
